Dr. Emiliano J. Buis is a lawyer (Concentration in Public International Law) (summa cum laude), BA in Classics (summa cum laude), University of Buenos Aires (UBA), LLM in National Defense (National Ministry of Defense, Argentina), Master II Recherche in Ancient History and Anthropology (Université de Paris I Panthéon-Sorbonne), PhD at the University of Buenos Aires (summa cum laude). He has also finished postgraduate specializations in the Law of Armed Conflicts and International Humanitarian Law (Institute of Space Law, National Air Force) and in Roman Law (UBA-Università di Roma II Tor Vergata). He has been a Postdoctoral Short-Term Fellow in Classics of the Argentine Government in the École des Hautes Études en Sciences Sociales (EHESS) and Université de Paris IV Sorbonne (January-February 2010) and a Postdoctoral Gastforscher-Stipendiat in Ancient Law at the Max-Planck-Institut für europäische Rechtsgeschichte in Frankfurt-am-Main (January 2011). He was a short-term Fellow at the Center for Hellenic Studies (Harvard University) and he's working on his Postdoctoral Research on the Historical Origins of International Law at the University of Buenos Aires

He is currently teaching Public International Law, International Humanitarian Law and The Origins of International Law in Antiquity, both at a graduate and postgraduate levels at the University of Buenos Aires Law School, the Central University (UNICEN) and the School of National Defense, Argentina. He is Lecturer in Ancient Greek Language and Literature at the Faculty of Philosophy and Literature (University of Buenos Aires), where he is also in charge of a Seminar on "Political Conceptions of Greek Texts" at the Master's Degree in Classical Studies.

He has been awarded the National Supreme Court Award, the Ruda Fellowship for the Academy of International Law in The Hague, a Second Place in the Human Rights Award of the Academy of Human Rights and Humanitarian Law (American University, Washington DC), a European Union AlBan Scholarship for Latin America and a DAAD Scholarship for the Human Rights Summer Course in the Europa-Universität Viadrina in Frankfurt-Oder.

He has officially participated in Latin American and European Research Projects since 1998 and has been recently promoted to Assistant Researcher at the CONICET (National

Research Council for Science and Technology). He has been a Research Associate at Brown University (Providence, RI) in 2003 and has been invited as a Research Fellow at the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona, the Università degli Studi di Firenze, the Fondation Hardt in Vandoeuvres-Geneva (as a young fellow) and the Université de Paris IV (Paris-Sorbonne).

He has edited six collective books and has widely published in several national and foreign journals on topics related to his fields of specialization and has conducted research at different universities for the past twelve years. He co-directs an UBACyT Research Project at the Faculty of Philosophy and Literature (UBA) dealing with law and politics in Ancient Greek literature, and has taken part in three international research networks (located in Bahía Blanca, Málaga and Oviedo). He is currently a research member of the CADRE (Centre for Ancient Drama and Its Reception) at the University of Nottingham in the United Kingdom, at the Center for Rhetoric and Oratory (Royal Holloway, University of London) and has been elected in 2008 as a Council Member for IPRA (International Peace Research Association) in Leuven, Belgium and in 2012 as a Global Fellow at the Carnegie Council for Ethics in International Affairs (New York). He is also in charge of the Permanent Seminar on the Theory and History of International Law (SEMPITHIDIA) at the Gioja Institute for Legal and Social Research of the Buenos Aires Law School.

For the last year he has been coordinating the Research Office at the University of Buenos Aires Law School. He is currently the Director of the French-Argentinian Center for Higher Education of the University of Buenos Aires.
