

Otto Luchterhandt



Prof. Dr. Otto Luchterhandt is a German legal scholar. Otto Luchterhandt studied from 1965 to 1970, the Science Law and Political Science, Slavic and East European History at the Universities of Freiburg and Bonn. In 1970, the first, 1975, the Second State Examination. 1974 PhD Luchterhandt at the University of Cologne with the work of Soviet state and the Russian Orthodox Church. In the years 1975-1990 he worked as a research assistant or associate at the Institute for Eastern European Law at the University of Cologne. In 1986 was his habilitation work with basic obligations as a constitutional problem in Germany. From 1988 to 1990 Luchterhandt has held professorships at the universities of Freiburg / Br., Cologne and Hamburg. From 1991 until his retirement in 2008 Luchterhandt taught as Professor of Public Law and Eastern European Law at the University of Hamburg and was Director of the Department of Ostrechtsforschung. Since 2003 he is Chairman of the Working Group Göttingen.
