

Bakhtiyar Tuzmukhamedov



Professor (International Law) Bakhtiyar Tuzmukhamedov is a Principal Research Fellow at the Diplomatic Academy of the Russian Ministry of Foreign Affairs. He was a judge at the Appeals Chamber of the UN International Criminal Tribunals for Rwanda and for the former Yugoslavia from 2012-2015, prior to which from 2009-2012 he was a trial judge at the UN International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda. He is a graduate of Moscow Institute of International Relations (1977) and Harvard Law School (LL.M'94). From 1992-2016 he was a senior staff member of the Constitutional Court of the Russian Federation (on unpaid sabbatical for the duration of international judicial term).

At various times he served as adviser with his country's delegations to the United Nations Special Committee on Peacekeeping Operations and the Special Committee on the Indian Ocean, Civil Affairs Officer with the UN Peace Forces in the former Yugoslavia, member of a group of experts of the UN Institute for Disarmament Research, member of the group of experts on the ICRC-sponsored Study of Customary Norms of International Humanitarian Law.

Professor Tuzmukhamedov is the editor-in-chief of three editions of the manual of international law, published under the auspices of the Russian Association of International Law in 2007, 2010 and 2014. The 2007 edition was translated into English and released by Eleven International Publishing. He has written extensively on international legal matters of international peace and security, international law in constitutional jurisdiction.

He is the Vice-President of the Russian Association of International Law, Deputy Editor-in-Chief of the Moscow Journal of International Law, member of the European and American Societies of International Law, member of the International Institute of international Law.
